That is exactly what we are doing at this point: planning. As we come closer to Actual Spring (it is of course, almost Easter), we are also looking at a Mission Project that will involve us connecting with the seasons and neighbors in need. As a way to live out our commitment to being a Matthew 25 congregation, we will be growing vegetables that will be harvested and shared with our neighbors and also those with food insecurity. The Mission Committee has purchased six planters



that we will set up here at Dickson Hollow. (The planters are each 4 feet long and about 3 feet high, for easy access without stooping or kneeling.) We will have some of the produce available for folks here to use for themselves and much of it will go to various food distribution sites. Through a group called Food for the Journey that was started last year by five congregations in the presbytery, we will be sending produce to be distributed at Apostle Presbyterian Church in West Allis.

As part of this project, we are going to need folks to help with planning what to grow in the planters, setting them up, planting them, watering and weeding, and ultimately harvesting the produce. People who are helping out with this do not need to be connected with the church, just be willing to help. If you are interested, please talk to me or Joe Fresch, chair of the Mission Committee. As we continue to muddle our way through these changing seasons, moving into the growing season, may we cultivate hope and eventual food that will help those in need.

Inaugural Dr. Wallace Cheatham Memorial Music Performance


