In last month's newsletter, I highlighted our participation with Food for the Journey. As a congregation, we will be growing produce that will be made available for those dealing with food insecurity. This gives us a chance to do



something good for a number of folks. Living in apartments, folks in Dickson Hollow don't have the same opportunity to garden as they did when they were in their own homes. This will allow people to get their "hands in the dirt," at least a little. We will also have the chance to share some of the produce with folks at the church and Dickson Hollow. We will put out some of the vegetables for a free-will offering, allowing folks to donate money that will be passed on to the local food pantries. Finally, by doing this, we will continue to live as a Matthew 25 congregation. Providing food and support to those in need is central to this mission and putting our faith into action.

In the coming weeks, we will be sending out more information about how you can participate in this project. This year we will be setting up the planters along the parking lot near the church entrance, where it will be easy access for those with limited mobility. Sometime in the middle of May, we will need help setting up the planters, filling them, and planting the vegetables. Over the course of the growing season, we will also need folks to help weed, water, and harvest the fruits of our labors. We will have sign-up sheets coming out at the end of May for that. People do not need to be a member of the congregation to help.

### **NEW BANNERS AND PARAMENTS**

The Worship Committee began discussing replacing some of the paraments (the cloth that hangs from the pulpit) in 2020. Some were very old and dated looking and all had been designed for use in our former location for a different pulpit. As we got into conversation, we shared how much we all enjoyed the added beauty of the wreath during Advent. So, a plan was put in place to not only look for new paraments, but to look into a few banners to help enhance the worship space.



The committee worked alongside Lisa, LHPC's administrative assistant (who is also a talented seamstress and costume/set designer for many theaters.) After much searching, the company **Jeff Wunrow Designs** was selected. The creative team at Wunrow has been hand-crafting liturgical

textiles for 15 years. Their seasonal banners and paraments grace sanctuaries across the country in churches of all sizes.

Liturgical colors mark the seasons and festivals of the Christian year. We change the banners and paraments to match each season or special service. As is depicted in the calendar on the left, each season or Sunday is designated a color:

White - Communion, Funerals, Epiphany, Baptism, Ascension, Transfiguration, Easter

<u>Purple</u> - Lent

Purple or Blue - Advent (we use Blue)

Red - Pentecost

<u>Green</u> – 'Ordinary time' (all other time periods not marked by a specific season.)

It was decided to purchase 3 sets of banners and paraments: Green, Purple, and White.

To cover the cost of this special project, the session approved the use of funds that had accumulated in Gifts and Memorials. This fund garners monies given to the church in memory of a loved one. Members and non-members have contributed to this fund through the years.






