The holidays are upon us. The mad dash from Thanksgiving to Christmas and New Years has begun. In a couple of days, the turkeys will be on the tables and folks will be gearing up for the Christmas shopping season. Tied up in all of these events are traditions that bring comfort, meaning, and memories.

In my family, a tradition that I remember fondly was the holiday meal, whether it was Thanksgiving or Christmas. My extended family would gather at my grandparents' house. The kitchen was the hub of activity. Because of the sights, sounds, and smells, the making of the mashed potatoes, right before the meal was prepared is indelibly etched in my memory: the call to make room between the stove and the sink, the billow of steam rising from the sink as the boiling water is poured off, the windows fogging up, the whir of the mixer going changing the chunks of white flesh into fluffy pillows mixed with milk and butter. While those gatherings don't happen in the same way anymore, mashed potatoes at Thanksgiving and Christmas still do. It is a tradition passed on from generation to generation.

Presbytery Meeting Recap


Thank you to Dorothy Dieter and Barb Foy for helping serve at the quarterly Presbytery Meeting that was held at Living Hope on November 19.


Update on Dedication Sunday
