**January 2023 Newsletter** 

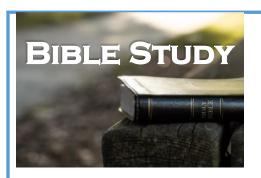

We've all made them in an attempt to help us change a little bit of who we are and how we act. Perhaps this year is no different for you, that you already have some goals in mind and are going to work on being a different "you" during 2023.

Whether you do have resolutions for 2023 or not, maybe instead you consider approaching the new year in a different way. So often, our resolutions are focused on "problems" that we have, things that we don't like about ourselves and our lives. Our Matthew 25 Mission Project last year was to grow food for the food pantry at Apostle Presbtyerian Church in West Allis. We grew lots of tomatoes, great herbs and some cucumbers that were harvested weekly July through September. We will have revised and updated planting schedule and new sign up sheets in May as we continue on into our second year of growing.

The remaining budgeted funds were given to:

- The Committee for the Promotion of Excellence in Music a scholarship fund in memory of Wallace Cheatham.
- **Penfield Children's Center** helping children with and without disabilities reach their full potential by providing early education, health and wellness services, and family programs in Milwaukee.
- Healing the Children Wisconsin Chapter partners with American healthcare providers to help underserved children around the world secure urgently needed medical care otherwise unobtainable.
- **Eras Senior Network** is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to engage and support seniors, adults with disabilities, and family caregivers in leading meaningful lives (formerly Interfaith, Waukesha)
- **Serenity Inns** offer an opportunity for holistic recovery from addiction and alcoholism to men who need it most, in a compassionate community of accountability.
- **Heifer International** accelerate the path to living incomes around the world through nutritious food, Shelter, clean water, education, access to health care and safe and secure environments.
- Waukesha and Falls Area Food Pantries an extra year end gift was made above the collected Food Pantry Sunday donations.
