"Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten in God's sight... you are of more value than many sparrows." (Luke 12:6-7)

As we have had a few people in the hospital and rehab in recent weeks, I have been reflecting on some of the challenges that we face as we get older. One common refrain that I have heard over the years from older adults is, "I just don't know why I'm still here!" This is often accompanied by an exasperated sigh or another question about why God won't just take them to heaven.

It can be hard dealing with the changing limits of our abilities. We look back at our younger years and marvel at all of the things that we used to do, wondering how we actually did them all. There is the reality that as we age our ability to do certain things does diminish. Our balance isn't what it once was; our stamina changes; our vision often gets worse; our memory may not be as sharp. When these things happen, it can feel like we are just husks of our younger selves. If we look at life as something that we are supposed to show results from it can be easy to see ourselves as "useless" when we aren't able to be as "productive" as we once were.

But when we listen to the Biblical witness, our value is not in what we produce, not in how many things we can do, but it is in whose we are. We are valued because God created us, God redeemed us, God continues to sustain us. Our worth is present no matter our level of ability or dis-ability. In fact, no matter our state of "productivity" there is still work that God has for us. It may not be what we once were able to do, but there are still contributions to God's kingdom that we are able to make.

Here in our congregation, we have a number of folks who are doing just that. We have a couple of members who volunteer to stuff envelopes and put labels on outgoing mail. We have a retired teacher who proofreads the bulletin and newsletter (provided we have it done in time). We have folks that stand up in front of

the congregation once every several weeks to lead us in the liturgy. If these are beyond your capability at this point, that's fine. There is still the need for folks to pray for the congregation and each other; there is still the need to remind each other of the care and compassion that is due to each of God's children.

No matter what you are able to do at this point in your life, you do have worth. God does value

you. God does have ministry for you. You are an important part of the life of God's kingdom and Living Hope.


One Great Hour of Sharing - Easter Sunday April 9
