Unfortunately he finds himself harassed by Bugs and eventually a bear. Throughout the cartoon, Elmer tries to find peace and quiet, a place to get away from it all, only to be stymied again and again by this rabbit that for some reason follow him wherever he goes.

Summer is coming (and the weather this past weekend surely confirmed it), and with it hopefully the chance to try and get away from the routine of our daily lives and find re-creation. ### **Summer Sermon Series**

The Revised Common Lectionary is a tool that a number of denominations and Biblical scholars have developed to suggest readings for use in worship on any given Sunday of the year on a three-year rotating basis. The listing provides four different readings for every week: an Old Testament reading, a Psalm, a Gospel reading, and a reading from the Epistles. These readings are chosen for the season, like Lent or Advent, or they will often go through a story line, choosing readings that follow one after another or help to cover a story arc. This year we have a couple of natural series that come from the lectionary. In June we will be following Abraham and Sarah and in July we

will hear Jesus tell parables about seeds and how they are like the kingdom of God.

June 11: God calls Abram and Sarai to leave their homeland

June 18: A son is promised to Abraham and Sarah

June 25: Hagar & Ishmael are sent away by Abraham & Sarah


July 16: The Parable of the Sower

July 23: The Parable of the Weeds Among the Wheat
