For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Jeremiah 29:11

According to national statistics, the average person has 12 jobs over the course of their career. Sometimes people stay in the same field and just move between employers, but there are also times where there are major shifts with people changing their fields in response to a sense that the purpose, they see in their lives needs to adjust to be in line with their happiness.

Christians also understand this shift in purpose. Spiritual leaders through the millennia have talked about how each one of us, when baptized, become part of a larger purpose and have specific parts to play in helping God's desired ends come to pass. They also recognize that these individual purposes change over the course of a lifetime.

Changing our sense of purpose over the course of our lives, therefore, is absolutely necessary. Even so, changing that sense of purpose can be very difficult. It's one of the reasons we see people fail at retirement and go back and find a job; it helps them find a purpose. It's also why people can find it hard to move away from their long-term home and not have those routines and connections that help to ground them with a sense of purpose. Over the years, I've also had a number of older adult members of my congregations tell me, "I don't know why I'm still here," as they reflect on what they are able to do to contribute to the life of the world.

This fall, Living Hope is going to be offering a 5-part class that addresses Purpose Past Retirement and Beyond, were we will talk about some of hard things that come with reimagining our purpose as life changes.



Over the course of those classes, we will explore some of the messages we get about aging and our usefulness, the power of purpose and how we can start to develop a personal purpose statement, how Christians have thought about purpose over the centuries and how that influences how we articulate our purpose, and finally look at how Living Hope can help support the folks in our community in living out that sense of purpose.

The classes will be offered at Dickson Hollow and available through the church's YouTube Channel both as a livestream and as a recorded resource to view at a later time. The exact dates and time have not been set, but we expect to have that finalized in the next few weeks.

Congregational Conversation

We want to hear from you!

On August 13th following worship, we will have a Congregational Conversation to check in with folks regarding a few items. With COVID continuing to be present, but at a lower rate, the session is interested to hear people's feeling about re-introducing some higher contact elements to our Sunday morning and how people feel about helping to facilitate some of those events. Some of the questions you might expect doing that conversation are:

- What elements of worship have stood out to you recently?
- What would you like to see as part of worship, even if it is occasionally?
- How do you feel about re-introducing Passing the Peace during worship where folks are moving around and sharing signs of peace and reconciliation?
- How do you feel about reintroducing Fellowship Time after worship where we have light refreshments and time to visit in the church area?
- If folks are in favor of re-starting Fellowship Time, how often should we consider doing it?
- If we do re-start Fellowship Time, are you willing and able to help facilitate it by preparing the drinks and food and helping to serve and clean up?

We will also be able to chat about other elements of worship and the life of the church that are on your mind. Please come and share your thoughts and opinions so our congregation can do a better job of serving our community. Expect that the conversation will take less than 30 minutes.

Building Update

In the coming months the heating and cooling system for Dickson Hollow is going to be undergoing a significant upgrade. This will address some of the significant issues that we have been experiencing in the church sections of the building.

During the process we will have to move most of the items that we have housed in the Resource Center (this includes paraments and banners not in use, Sunday School resources, and computer servers). You will see these items stored in other areas of the church's space. This is temporary, but necessary to give the HVAC company space to work and ensure that our items do not get ruined by the dust and debris.

It is anticipated that this work will run for several months starting in the fall. As with any building project, the exact timeframe is not fully know. Please check with the church office if you have any questions.
