
December 2023 Newsletter

As we come into December and the season of Advent, we come into a time that can be hard for some folks. This time of year emphasizes getting together with family and friends, going to parties and celebrations, and, in general, having a jolly old time. However, when we are living with the grief of a loved one who has died or dealing with the pressures that comes with gatherings, it can be really hard to be fully present in the holy-day festivities.

This year, our theme for Advent is "A Weary World Rejoices." It recognizes that we live in a complex world where our emotions and experiences are not always in line with the expectations. We do live in a world that even when things are moving along well, it can be a daily grind. There is

stress that seems to be ever present, even if at a low level. We listen to what is happening in the broader world and we can't help but feel concerned. The question is: how do we find hope, joy, and wonder in a world where it can be so hard to see the good? How do we rejoice while living in a weary world?

Over the four Sundays of Advent we will explore this question by looking at the first chapter of Luke and the stories of birth announcements that are held there. We will follow the family of John the Baptizer, Zechariah and Elizabeth, and also listen to Mary and her story. We will hear how they deal with their grief, fear, and apprehension while also embracing the good news that they receive from God



about God's actions in the world. We talk about how we deal with our losses, our concerns and worries, when we are in the most wonderful time of the year (even if it's not).

During the coming month, my invitation to all of us is to recognize both those hard things that are present in this time of year and also the blessings and promises that are abundant. It is okay to have both, in fact, it is expected. It is these exact situations to which God speaks and acts with the gift of Jesus. Without the hard things in our lives, without the weariness that this world creates, there would be no need for Christ or this season to help us remember that God is with us, bringing new and glorious morns.

May we all have a blessed Advent season where we do rejoice even in a weary world.





Christmas Joy Offering

On Sunday, December 17, we collect the last of the Four for Four offerings for the PC (USA).

The Christmas Joy Offering has been a cherished Presbyterian tradition since the 1930s. The Offering distributes gifts equally to the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and to Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color. The Assistance Program provides critical financial support to church workers and their families. Presbyterian-related schools and colleges provide education and leadership development while nurturing racial and ethnic heritage. This has been a Presbyterian commitment for nearly 140 years.

Average November Attendance




