

From the Pastor...

November 2023 Newsletter

November 1st is All Saints' Day. It is a day where we are invited to pause and remember those sisters and brothers in faith that have shown us God and now are with Christ in the resurrection. This remembrance is both a time of grief where we acknowledge the losses that we have experienced by no longer having those people we love close to us. It is also a time of thanksgiving for the gifts that God has given us through their lives and witness.

This year Living Hope partnered with Dickson Hollow to hold a Service of Remembrance to celebrate and mourn the approximately 30 individuals connected with Dickson Hollow that have died in the past year. Realizing that number of people connected with Dickson Hollow have died this past year and that there have been seven memorial services for folks connected to Living Hope in 2023 puts the sense of loss that many in our community might be feeling into perspective. The loss of friends and companions, partners and spouses profoundly affect us. The loss of someone who we may not have known well, but saw regularly can leave a small hole in our lives, where we miss the brief conversations or even the simple nods of hello. The loss of a spouse of 50 or 60 years can leave us without part of ourselves; figuring out how to function without them can be debilitating.

Losses leave us charting a world that can feel unfamiliar or even foreign. In order to live through our losses, we have to take time to acknowledge them, recognizing those things that brings us grief and sadness. Avoiding those feelings, pushing them away, can be a strategy at first so we aren't overwhelmed by the experience. However, if we continually

do that, eventually the sense of loss will catch up to us and demand our attention, even if we don't recognize it as connected to particular losses.

But the other part of All Saints' remembrances is also necessary for us as we tend our losses. We also need to take time to remember those things that we have to give thanks for. Giving thanks



for the gifts that we have received from those friends who have died, recognizing how God has worked through them in our lives, is crucial for living with grief. By remembering gratitude, we see how those things that are no longer tangibly with us still are present in a different way. We are able to cultivate memories that inspire and comfort; we are able to see how life has shifted since that time bringing new challenges and opportunities; we are able to recognize how God has been present through it all and will continue to be with us even when we are experiencing a new loss.

As we observe All Saints' Day this year, we are indeed invited to remember and mourn the losses that we have experienced in our lives. We are also invited to join in gratitude for what God has done for us in the lives and experiences that have passed into God's eternal care. May we do both in this time.


