

Brookfield Road Building Update

The former building of Brookfield Presbyterian Church, located at 1485 Brookfield Road in Brookfield is slated to be demolished in mid-January 2024. The buyer of the property completed paying our congregation for the land contract in 2017, but has not done anything to maintain the building. The City of Brookfield has declared unfit for occupation and, due to structural issues from the years of neglect, ordered it to be torn down. The contractor is currently in process of preparing the building for demolition and expects to have it completed sometime in January.

Living Hope has no financial interest in the property since the land contract was paid in full. However, members and friends of the congregation who have emotional connections to the building may wish to stop by and see the building before it is torn down. Thankfully, we know that congregations are not their buildings, but rather the people who gather to worship God and join together in mission no matter the physical location. Even so, watching a building that housed so many memories and people worked hard to maintain be torn down can evoke emotions. Know that if you wish to talk about your experience or share memories of that special place, Will is glad to spend some time with you as you do so.
