The weather this past week definitely has felt like March, but even more so. The wild swings in temperatures and weather almost take your breath away. Sunny and 70 on Tuesday afternoon, then we wake up on Wednesday morning to snow blanketing the ground and 20 degrees. The 50 degree rollercoaster was not welcome.

We've also seen this shifting between extremes this Lent as we have been looking at Peter as an example of our lives. The way he goes back and forth between faith and doubt, bold acts of witness and then seeming to have missed Jesus' point completely, is true for us as well. His enthusiasm for following Jesus is paired with his fear of being associated with him when the stakes are high. If we are honest with ourselves, it is probably pretty similar with us too.

As we come to Holy Week and Easter at the end of this month, we will continue to follow Peter. We will see him join the crowd welcoming Jesus into Jerusalem. We will see him in the upper room and then at the Garden of Gethsemane. We will see the acts of faith and the times where fear and doubt take over. But most importantly, we will see him at the

tomb. There Peter is truly a reflection of us. Wonder, confusion, uncertainty, not fully understanding what the empty tomb means. This is who we are, full of complex emotions, struggling with parts of ourselves that pull in different directions. And it is okay. If God can use Peter, God can surely use us. If Jesus called Peter, Jesus calls us as well. If Peter was so full of changes and contradictions, we can be as well, even as we come to Easter.

May the remainder of Lent and the coming season of Easter be times of reflection and deepening our experience of God ever present with us. May we find ourselves welcomed by God, affirmed by God, even gently corrected by God so that we truly can celebrate the Resurrection. May this Easter find all of us, complex as we are, connected more closely to Jesus who knows us more fully that we know ourselves.
