Last month I shared with you the decision the session made to share our any extra funds with a number of community partners. This month, I want to share with you one way that we can continue to spread that work of mission.



The Guest House is a not-for-profit organization in Milwaukee that works with people dealing with homelessness and people who are in danger of becoming homeless. Formed in 1981 by the Central City Churches Outreach Ministry, located in the Sherman Park neighborhood, the Guest House now has their main campus on 13th Street near downtown.



The Guest House has expanded their services to be more than just shelter. They provide support for people in danger of becoming homeless, help for folks with addiction issues, shelter for those working to move out of homelessness, and food to those currently living in less than ideal situations.

The Guest House has a whole group of professionals that help people to find apartments, rent them, and learn skills to stay independent in those apartments. This group also provides support when the landlords are not complying with ordinances and maintenance of the apartments and contract support when there are disagreements about the legal requirements for both tenant and landlord.

Another group works with men who are experiencing chronic homelessness and the many issues that often accompany homelessness. They have an 86-bed facility that provides shelter, treatment services, counseling, and training to men that are working to transition out of homelessness and into permanent, stable living situations.





#### Wallace Cheatham Memorial Music Performance

The Dr. Wallace Cheatham Memorial Music Performance honors the legacy of a gifted musician, educator, and composer, Dr. Wallace Cheatham. For over fifteen years Dr. Cheatham served as music director at Living Hope Presbyterian Church where he trained and lead the choir, accompanied the congregation and choir, and provided special music. Dr. Cheatham was also a gifted music educator, teaching in Milwaukee Public Schools and training many vocalists through the years. In addition, Dr. Cheatham was involved with many community groups, including The New Jubilee Children's Choir, The New Jubilee Youth Chorale and the African



American Children's Theatre. In memory of his gifts and contributions, the congregation of Living Hope Presbyterian Church established a fund to provide an emerging musical artist of color an opportunity to share their gifts and talents with the community of faith and encourage their continued work of bringing beauty into the world.

Our featured singers this year are Olivia Coleman and Monica Bruce. Olivia and Monica are both students at the Peck School for the Arts at the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee. Look for more information in the bulletin in the coming weeks.


