January 2025 Newsletter

In a couple of weeks, on January 12th, we will celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. On that Sunday we remember how Jesus went to John at the Jordan and was baptized. That day we will also remember our own baptisms and the call from God that comes through baptism. Additionally, we will witness to seven individual's response to God's call that comes through their baptisms. During our worship service that day we will either ordain and install folks or just install them since they have previously been ordained as elders or deacons.

In the Presbyterian Church we recognize two sacraments, baptism and communion. We do both because Jesus did them and commanded us to follow his example. We do communion many times over our lives, but baptism we do only once. Baptism is an outward sign of an inward reality, just as communion is. The actual waters of baptism don't really cleanse us of our sin, but points to a deeper reality that Jesus' life, death and resurrection provide that cleansing for us. When we are baptized, however, we (or our parents) recognize that something has changed in our lives; we recognize God's call on our lives and desire to respond to that with joy and faith. Our lives as Christians are rooted in our baptism. So, on January 12th, we will remember that important day in our lives, even if we don't remember it ourselves, since we were too young.

We will also ordain and install elders and deacons to service on Session and the Board of Deacons respectively. This time of commitment and vows is an offshoot of baptism. We believe God calls all people to ministry and there are many different types of service. Some people are called to serve in leadership either as an elder, helping to make decisions about the life of the congregation, or a deacon, providing for the care and nurture of God's people. To recognize these particular types of service, we, as a congregation, enter into a covenant to support those taking on leadership roles and, for those leading, to serve with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love.

I hope you will join us on January 12th for this time of remembering Jesus and our baptisms as we move into ministry in 2025.

Member/Affiliate Conversation - Sunday, January 19


If you are a regular attender here at Living Hope, but have a congregation that you have been a member at for a long time and don't want to change your membership, you can become an Affiliate Member of Living Hope.

Affiliate membership recognizes the relationship that you have with Living Hope without having to give up the relationship that you have with your congregation. Unfortunately, being an affiliate member doesn't allow you to serve on the session (church board) or as a deacon, but there are many other ways that you can get involved here at Living Hope.

If you have questions about or are interested in Affiliate Membership, please talk with Pastor Will or one of the members of the session. If you decide that you would like to join as an affiliate member, we will send a letter to your home congregation letting them know about your desire to become an affiliate member and that we are here to help them as they continue to care for you as a member of their congregation. We will also have a new members/affiliate conversation January 19 after worship, where we will talk more about what it means to be a Presbyterian and also go over the details of both full membership and affiliate membership.

Starting January 23rd, our spring Adult Study
Series will focus on what does it mean to be
Presbyterian. We will use Donald McKim's 2003
edition of Presbyterian Questions, Presbyterian
Answers as our jumping off point for this series.
The classes will meet on the first and third
Thursdays at 1:30 in the Fellowship Hall and will



be available on channel 966 in Dickson Hollow and our YouTube streaming service. Over the course of seven session, we will look at the history and governance structure of the Presbyterian Church (USA), Presbyterian understandings of the Bible, who God and Jesus are, what the Holy Spirit does and how humanity responds, what is salvation and how the church participates in that, worship and sacraments, and what the Christian life should look like and how God's reign over the universe is envisioned.

Copies of the book will be ordered ahead of time for interested participants. Because of the age of the book, copies will be previously used. If you are interested in receiving a copy, please sign up on the sheet with the ushers to reserve your copy. Please note you do NOT need to have a book to participate in the class. Additionally, you do not need to attend all of the sessions, since they will not build on one another, but they will be recorded for later reference.


