
Mid Aug - Sept 2025 Newsletter

The end of summer is near. I can tell by the way activities have suddenly increased at our house, the number of school supplies sitting around waiting to be packed up and loaded into lockers at school, and of course, the kids starting to find ways to milk every last minute out of their break as possible.

It also means that here at the church things shift a bit too. We'll keep Bible Study going as we have throughout the summer, but we'll also start our adult education series. Over the past few years, we've developed a pattern of having adult education time on the First and Third Thursdays at 1:30 pm. This time is a chance to delve a little deeper into specific topics and ideas that we can use in growing our faith.

This fall we will be looking at the Apostles, their lives, the Biblical witness to them, and what tradition has claimed about them. Over the six sessions (September 18, October 2 & 16, November 6 & 20, and December 4) we will look at what it meant to be an apostle, how they came into that role, what they did that helped to witness to Christ as Lord and Savior, and how we might be able to learn from them and follow their example.

Coming Soon for Special Offerings

The 226th General Assembly (2024) approved several changes to the churchwide Special Offerings to take effect January 1, 2026. We will be moving from 4 special offerings to three. The Pentecost offering has been split



between the other three. With this change, we also will not be directing a portion of the funds to a local ministry (Pentecost and Peace and Global Witness.)

Next Year's Three Offerings

One Great Hour of Sharing — Offering season Feb. 18–April 5, 2026

Traditionally received on Palm Sunday or Easter

Causes supported: disaster, hunger, poverty, climate change, immigration, migration and refugees

World Communion Offering — Offering season Sept. 6-Oct. 4, 2026

Traditionally received on World Communion Sunday - first Sunday in Oct.

Causes supported: racial justice, gender justice, peacemaking, global witness, ecumenical and interfaith relations

As part of this Offering, a grant program is being created that allows any council of the PC(USA) — session, presbytery or synod regardless of participation in the World Communion Offering — to apply for funds to support their own efforts to do ministry around these cause areas.

Christmas Joy Offering — Offering season Nov. 29–Dec. 19, 2026

Traditionally received on the fourth Sunday of Advent or Christmas Eve

Causes supported: children-at-risk, youth and young adults, leadership development for people of color, Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color, servants of the Church in need through the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions.

Peace & Global Witness Offering enables the church to promote the Peace of Christ by addressing systems of conflict and injustice across the world. Through the Peace & Global Witness Offering, congregations are encouraged and equipped to find and address the anxiety and discord that is prevalent throughout this broken and sinful world.

Living Hope will collect this offering on Sunday, October 5 - World Communion Sunday.

Communion Bread Update

Starting in September, Living Hope is going to experiment with going gluten-free at communion. Before COVID, we had a gluten free option for people taking communion by intinction. After COVID, we made changes and adjusted how we did communion and also dropped the option for gluten-free bread. Now, in an effort to be inclusive of folks with gluten intolerance, the Worship Committee has decided to try using only gluten-free for distribution at communion. We will evaluate it over the next few months and see if this is something that we want to continue or if we need to find a different option.
